Honor Air Flight

On Saturday, May 13, 2017, Veteran and Trinity View resident Robert “Bob” Ward flew to Washington, DC with the local honor Air Chapter based out of Hendersonville, known as the *Blue Ridge Honor Flight*. The organization takes Veterans that served in WWII, Vietnam, and the Korean War to Washington, DC to see the memorials all in one day. The day consisted of the World War II Memorial followed by the Women’s Veterans Memorial, The Battle of Iwo Jima and finally the Vietnam, Korean, and Lincoln Memorials. Several Veterans in attendance were honored with a special medal presented by the Korean Attaché. Close to a hundred local Veterans from Buncombe and Hendersonville Counties partook in the trip and were greeted with praises from local admirers including the Boy and Girl Scouts, retired Military personal, families, friends and other Veterans from around the area. *God Bless our Trinity View Veterans!*

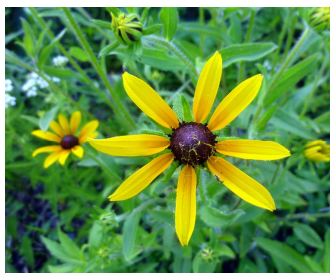
